Program Updates

What are the clinical sites we will be rotating through starting for the academic year 2025-2026?

We are excited to announce the growth of our clinical sites for the upcoming academic year. We have expanded from two rotation sites to three to include Good Samaritan Hospital (Vincennes Indiana), Deaconess Gateway Hospital (Evansville Indiana), and the Evansville VA clinic (Evansville Indiana). With this expansion, the opportunity for a more well-rounded and diverse experience is now available!

How many spots will be offered for the 2025-2026 academic year?

With expansion and transition to the new rotation sites we will be filling six categorical spots and four preliminary spots for the year. This slight reduction is to ensure during a time of transition we maintain the highest standard of education.

Is St. Vincent still a rotation site?

No. St. Vincent will no longer be a rotating site for the residency program. As above we have expanded the program to additional clinical sites, creating a robust clinical experience.

Will we rotate at each location?

YES! It is important to have a broad and diverse experience during your residency. All residents will have experiences at all three sites. It is the hope that we keep as close to an even split for rotations at our expanded clinical sites.

Where will our continuity clinic be located?

Our continuity clinic sites will continue to be at Good Samaritan Hospital with the second site transitioning to the Evansville VA clinic. These sites will be assigned to you based on our schedule structure.

I heard there were changes coming to the scheduling model, is this true?

Yes! Based off feedback from past residents and the desire to give the best educational experience while balancing the highest level of patient care, the program will be transitioning to a X+Y model for scheduling on JULY 1, 2025. The program will be following the 4+1 version of the X+Y model resulting in four-week core rotations followed by one full week in the continuity clinic.

Are there any transitions regarding scholarly activity with the program?

SWIM is committed to continuing a high level of scholarly activity for all of those interested and those pursuing fellowship. We are excited to grow our resources in this arena with continued support from IU school of medicine as well as now involvement from the Deaconess Research Institute!

Do we receive any stipend from the program for academic endeavors?

Yes, a recent change to our program was the implementation to a yearly education fund to best help fund your continued academic and professional growth. Each year you will receive a stipend (amount varies by year group) to use towards presenting scholarly work at conferences, attending skills/workshops conferences, attending board review courses, buying question banks for the ABIM etc. Of note, the program DOES purchase a three-year membership for all residents to MSKAP their intern year.

Do I have to live in one certain location?

No. With the rotations being split amongst the three rotation sites there will be some degree of driving over your three years. However, there are many areas that serve as a nice geographic middle ground greatly reducing your travel time to each rotation site. A comprehensive list of resources regarding housing and commutes will be sent promptly following match day to start future planning!
